A Message for Parents

As the first and most important teachers of your children your input is essential in order to form your children in the Roman Catholic Faith.

Weekly participation in Sunday Mass (or Saturday evening) is the most effective way to form children in the faith because they experience the ritual week after week and they encounter God in the Scripture readings and in the Eucharist. They also become familiar with the parish community.

A good way to help your children prepare for Sunday Mass is to read the Gospel and share what its message means for you. This family activity would help all members of your family to be more open to hearing God's message at Mass.

PREPARING FOR SUNDAY LITURGY: HOW DO WE DO IT?

- Begin by focusing on the Gospel only. (If your children are older you can also read the other scripture passages.)
- Invite one of your children to find the Gospel passage in the Bible. Use any translation. On Sundays we hear the New American Bible.
- Or, access the reading online through the parish website www.stjosephsbabylon.org. Click on READINGS AND REFLECTIONS (on left side of home page). Scroll down to www.nccbuscc.org. You will see a calendar. Click on the date of the coming Sunday and you will access all the readings exactly as they will be heard at mass.
- Invite your children to listen carefully as you read the Gospel. Then suggest listening for a word or phrase that stands out. Slowly read the Gospel again.
- What is God saying to you in these words? If you had to get up and give a homily on these readings what would you say?



PARENT MEETINGS AND SPECIAL LITURGIES

We look forward to your presence at parent meetings and special liturgies. Please mark your calendar with the event dates listed in this booklet that pertain to your child's grade level. Please call the Faith Formation Office if you are unable to attend a scheduled event.

ATTENDANCE

Weekly attendance is required in order for a child to successfully complete each grade level. Please phone the catechist when your child must miss the Faith Formation group and then, to the best of your ability, make up the missed chapter with your child. Children are expected to attend each scheduled session.

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

Each child is to be escorted by a parent, guardian, or designated adult to the door of the catechist's home or to the door of the catechist's meeting room in the Center. At dismissal time the child will be released by the catechist (home or meeting room) only to the parent, guardian or designated adult.

"INFORMATION FOR THE CATECHIST" FORM

Your child will be given an "Information for the Catechist" form at the first meeting. Please return the information form **to the catechist** at your child's next Faith Formation group meeting.

CONTACT WITH CATECHISTS

We encourage you to be in communication with your child's catechist. The catechist is available to share or clarify any concerns you might have. If your child is unable to attend a meeting, please notify the catechist prior to the meeting.

PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT

After each meeting of your child's Faith Formation group try to find time to read the chapter presented by the catechist that week and discuss its content with your child. A schedule for the year will be taped inside your child's text. **CHILDREN LEARN BEST WHEN PARENTS ARE INVOLVED.**

BUILDING PROCEDURES
For groups meeting at the Parish Center

For a variety of reasons, we have begun to require that all Faith Formation groups meet at the parish center. During the 2010-2011 year, all levels 1, 2, 3 & 4 Faith Formation groups will be in the building in addition to children in other levels whose catechists have chosen to meet at St. Joseph.

Arrival and Dismissal –

- Every child must be accompanied to and from the classroom by an adult.
- Stairways are marked “up” and “down”; please use the proper stairways to help alleviate congestion.
- We ask that the children be in the rooms five minutes prior to the starting time so that the group can begin on time.
- For the safety of the children, we ask that parents please park in a designated parking spot and walk the child to either the “staff entrance” which is in the rear of the building across from the thrift shop, or to the “nursery school” entrance with the ramp which is a North Carll Ave. entrance, and then to the classroom.
- Do not leave your child in the classroom if the catechist is not present.

Hall Monitors – there are three hallways at the center that are used by Faith Formation. The ideal is to have parents volunteer to monitor each of these hallways when the children are in the building. Please call the Faith Formation office 587-4717 if you are willing to help with this effort. It involves occasionally escorting a young child to the rest room and back and sitting in the hallway to make certain that the children are safely in their rooms. It is a good opportunity to read the newspaper or a good book while your child is participating in a Faith Formation session.

Footwear – footwear with wheels is not permitted in the building.

Food - no food or drinks are permitted in the building during the catechetical sessions.

Toys, I-Pods, etc. – please leave all distractions at home. The children have only one hour per week to focus on their formal religious education.

Books – parents are asked to buy a work book for each of their children; the books are sold in the Faith Formation office. Please send the work book with the child each week.

If your child will be absent – please call the catechist if your child will not be present so that the catechist isn’t waiting for your child to arrive before she/he begins the session.

LEVEL 3

Christ Jesus, the Way has as its theme the story of Jesus at the wedding at Cana (see John 2:1-11). Just as Mary urged the servants to “Do what he tells you,” the children learn throughout the year that they, too, are called to do as Jesus asks. In order to follow Jesus, they learn about what Jesus said and did by exploring the Word of God and the teachings of the Church. The story of the wedding at Cana shows that God’s children are rewarded when they follow Jesus’ command. Level 3 teaches the children that all are called to be apostles of Jesus, loving God and one another, and spreading the Good News everywhere.

LEVEL 7

Call to Faith - Jesus Christ – Jesus Christ is the theme for level 7. The goal is to connect the teachings of the faith with everyday living and with opportunities to continue learning. Youth are provided various ways to live the faith and continue to grow in faith through prayer, faith learning, and participation in the sacraments. They will discuss the Incarnation, Jesus as a Model of Wisdom, Jesus' Relationships, Christ, who is Our Savior, Christ who offers Life, and the Church (us) as One in Christ.

Please Note: Level 7 is separate and distinct from Confirmation. Catechists are responsible for helping students complete Level 7.

Parents and sponsors are responsible for helping the children prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation. (If your family has a level 7 child who wishes to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation in spring 2011, please see the page entitled "Confirmation 2011" for important dates.)

Level 7 classes will begin meeting the week of September 20 and end the week of December 6.

CONFIRMATION 2011

The preparation for Confirmation is a process of:

- growing in knowledge and love of Jesus Christ
- actively participating in the life of the church at the parish of St. Joseph through weekly participation in Sunday liturgy and service to others
- learning the meaning of Confirmation and its symbols

Parents are the first and most important teachers of their children in the faith. Children learn discipleship of Jesus from their parents who teach by the way they live.

CONFIRMATION PREPARATION SCHEDULE 2010 – 2011

1. **Thursday, September 30, 2010** – Meeting for **PARENTS ONLY** – 10:00 – 11:00 am or 7:30 – 8:30 pm in Msgr. Nolan Hall. – This meeting is for parents of children who plan to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Spring of 2011. Parents will be informed of the guidelines that the Diocese of Rockville Center has handed down regarding a young person's readiness to be Confirmed.
2. **Monday, October 4, 2010** – Meeting for parents and candidates 4:00-5:00 pm or 7:00-8:00 pm in Msgr. Nolan Hall.
3. **Weekend of October 16 & 17, 2010** – **Covenants to be presented** to the priest at any Mass this weekend (gold paper)
4. **Saturdays, January 22 & 29, 2011** – **Confirmation retreats** in Msgr. Nolan Hall from 9:30 am until 2:30 pm. Confirmation candidates will be assigned to attend one of these days. (*If you are not able to attend on your assigned date, please call the Faith Formation Office to request a change of date.*) Lunch will be served.

5. **Weekend of February 5 & 6, 2011** – return community service pledges at any Mass this weekend (red paper)

6. **Monday, February 7, Wednesday, February 9, Thursday, February 10, Wednesday, February 16, Thursday, February 17, 2011** – Confirmation readiness interviews from 6:00 until 8:00 pm in the O’Connell Room. Confirmation candidates will be interviewed by a member of the St. Joseph community. The interview will take about 15 minutes. Confirmation candidates will receive a letter from the Faith Formation Office apprising them of the date and time of their personal interview.

ST. JOSEPH YOUTH BAND

The St. Joseph Youth Band is a teen-based ensemble of male and female vocalists and a wide range of musicians. The instrumental makeup of the band changes each year as new members join and others graduate, but it basically consists of guitar, bass and percussion. Throughout its 15-year history, however, it has boasted violins, viola, trumpet, flute, oboe, clarinet, keyboard, and even sax! The band's repertoire is quite eclectic –everything from contemporary “praise and worship” music, to folk-rock, to traditional Latin chant. **Music Director Jean Cooper** works with the group to fine tune their music skills while imparting an understanding of the liturgy.

The band serves the parish community by providing the music for the 5:00 pm Eucharistic Liturgy each Sunday throughout the school year (September-June.) From time to time, they also play for other special events such as the annual Beach Mass, Village of Babylon night of Christmas caroling, the Christmas Vigil Mass, Holy Week Stations and Veneration of the Cross, Advent and Lenten vespers, visits to homes for the elderly, and Faith Formation programs.

Rehearsals: The band generally meets at 3:45 PM in the church each Sunday during the school year. In the event there is a liturgy in progress in the church at that time, they move their pre-Mass practice to the Hospitality Center, across the lane to the south side of the church.

CATECHISTS

Catechists are volunteers who share their faith with the children of our parish.

This year, all Level 1, Level 2, Level 3 & Level 4 classes will be held in the parish center (no level 1, 2, 3 or 4 groups will meet in the homes of catechists).

Current catechists for levels 5, 6 & 7 may choose to meet with their groups in the Center on Tuesdays or Wednesdays at 3:45-4:45 pm or 5:15-6:15 pm or 6:45-7:45 pm or they may choose to teach at home.

Catechists who invite children into their homes choose the day and time for the weekly meetings. Two background checked adults must be present in the home when the children meet there. The ideal group size for the building is 10 children and for a home is 6 children.

Therefore **many** catechists are needed. Please consider sharing **your** faith with a small group of children.

Three catechist meetings are offered for each grade level to discuss the content of upcoming lessons and to keep the catechists apprised of what's new in the parish. The meetings begin in Msgr. Nolan Hall with prayer, general remarks and information and then move to classrooms where Grade Level Coordinators review the key theological points to be presented in the upcoming units. The Catechist Manuals provide a wealth of information. The Grade Level Coordinators keep in frequent telephone contact and/or e-mail contact with their catechists. The Director and Faith Formation Staff provide calendars, lesson plans, and student handouts. All do their best to support catechists in their ministry.



VIRTUS

LITURGY OF THE WORD WITH CHILDREN

9:30AM SUNDAY EUCHARIST

MSGR. NOLAN HALL

On many Sundays, September through June, children ages 6 to 11 are invited to leave the main worship space before the Liturgy of the Word and proceed to a worship area designed specifically with the children in mind. Catechists and Scripture Sharers read and share the Sunday readings with the children. There are two worship areas designated for these children, one for children K through Grade 2 and another for Grade 3 through 6. Children return to their parents for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

RCIA – FOR ADULTS

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the formation process by which adults are initiated into the Catholic Church. Any adult who is interested in becoming a Catholic or who is a Catholic and has not celebrated First Eucharist or Confirmation is encouraged to call the Parish Office at 669-0068 and ask to speak to Msgr. Chris.

RCIA ADAPTED FOR CHILDREN

We welcome all children age 7 and above, **who have never been baptized, who are coming from another faith, or have been baptized in the Roman Catholic Faith but are between the ages of 10 & 17 and have not received catechesis for Eucharist and Confirmation**, into the church through participation in an adapted form of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. A meeting with the Director of Faith Formation is required.

The parents, who are the first and most

important teachers of their children, have a key role in this journey of initiation. Weekly Mass participation is expected of all RCIA families. The 9:30am Mass in Msgr. Nolan Hall offers the best experience for children. We encourage parents to prepare their children to begin this process by reading and discussing with them the book *Jesus Lives: Faith Stories for Young Children or Jesus Lives: Faith Stories for Ages 11 to 14*. These little books are available in the Faith Formation Office for \$10.00.

GLOSSARY

Catechesis – efforts which help individuals and communities acquire and deepen Christian faith and identity.

Catechist – the individual who leads a group of children or adults to acquire and deepen Christian faith and identity.

Eucharist – the Church community’s celebration of the sacramental meal Jesus had with his friends on the night before he died. Also called the “Lord’s Supper” and the “Mass”.

Initiation - the step-by-step process by which a person becomes a full member of the community of the Church. This process includes instruction, formation, and special liturgical rites, culminating in the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

Liturgy – public worship offered to God by the Church, particularly in the celebration of the Eucharist.

Mass - the most common term used to designate the celebration of the Eucharist.

Para-liturgy - formal prayer service.

Reconciliation – the sacrament of Reconciliation, also called Penance (once called Confession) is a special experience of God’s love. It renews our bond with God and others that is injured or broken by sin. The Eucharist also is a sacrament of Reconciliation. Through it we receive forgiveness for our daily faults and are drawn closer to God and each other.

Sacrament - a high point in the manifestation of God’s love for us, and a high point of our response to that love. The Church designates seven events in its liturgy as sacraments: Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Reconciliation, Marriage, Holy Orders and Anointing of the Sick.

Volunteer's Code of Conduct

Our children are the most important gifts God has entrusted to us. As a volunteer, I promise to strictly follow the rules and guidelines in this Volunteer's Code of Conduct as a condition of my providing services to the children and youth of our parish.

As a volunteer, I will:

- Treat everyone with respect, loyalty, patience, integrity, courtesy, dignity, and consideration.
- Avoid situations where I am alone with children and/or youth at Church activities.
- Use positive reinforcement rather than criticism, competition, or comparison when working with children and/or youth.
- Refuse to accept expensive gifts from children and/or youth or their parents without prior written approval from the pastor or administrator.
- Refrain from giving expensive gifts to children and/or youth without prior written approval from the parents or guardian and the pastor or administrator.
- Report suspected abuse to the pastor, administrator, or appropriate supervisor and *the New York State Child Registry (1-800-342-3720)*. I understand that failure to report suspected abuse to civil authorities is, according to the law, a misdemeanor.
- Cooperate fully in any investigation of abuse of children and/or youth.

As a volunteer, I will not:

- Smoke or use tobacco products in the presence of children and/or youth.
- Use, possess, or be under the influence of alcohol at any time while volunteering.
- Use, possess, or be under the influence of illegal drugs at any time.
- Pose any health risk to children and/or youth (i.e., no fevers or other contagious situations).
- Strike, spank, shake, or slap children and/or youth.
- Humiliate, ridicule, threaten, or degrade children and/or youth.
- Touch a child and/or youth in a sexual or other inappropriate manner.
- Use any discipline that frightens or humiliates children and/or youth.
- Use profanity in the presence of children and/or youth.

I understand that as a volunteer working with children and/or youth, I am subject to a thorough background check including criminal history. I understand that any action inconsistent with this Code of Conduct or failure to take action mandated by this Code of Conduct may result in my removal as a volunteer with children and/or youth.
